


What is a database?

Boolean Searching


AND	Narrows search to only items containing both terms; best for combining related concepts

OR	Broadens search to items containing any terms; best for combining synonyms and related terms Climate Change OR Global Warming					
	Climate Change OR Global Warming					
NOT	Narrows search to items containing one term but not another					
	Climate Change NOT Polar Bears					

Boolean Searching

AND	Narrows search to only items containing both terms; best for combining related concepts


