

Lesson Plan: Source Evaluation via SIFT Technique

Lesson Objective:

Learners will be able to evaluate a website or online source to determine if it is appropriate to use for a specific information need.

Time: 60 min

Audience: High school students; College students; Public library patrons (young adult, adult)

Instructor preparation:

- Identify a website/online source and write a scenario about a specific information need related to that source.
- Update the **Activity: Source Evaluation via SIFT Technique** document with chosen scenario, website URL, and tailored activity prompts.

Time	Section	Details
<10 min.	Intro	Learners conduct a quick review (~ 3min) of a given source and write down the methods they used to determine the source's credibility. Learners share their assessment with each other. Quick poll: would you use this source for [a research assignment]?

<30 min	Apply	In groups or solo, learners conduct a review of the original source (from Intro section) using: Activity: Source Evaluation via SIFT Technique
10 min	Reflect	Learners share their discoveries, insights, and observations about the activity. Reflection prompt: Name one thing you'll do differently as a result of this session.



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
